Thank you once again for your unwavering support and partnership.

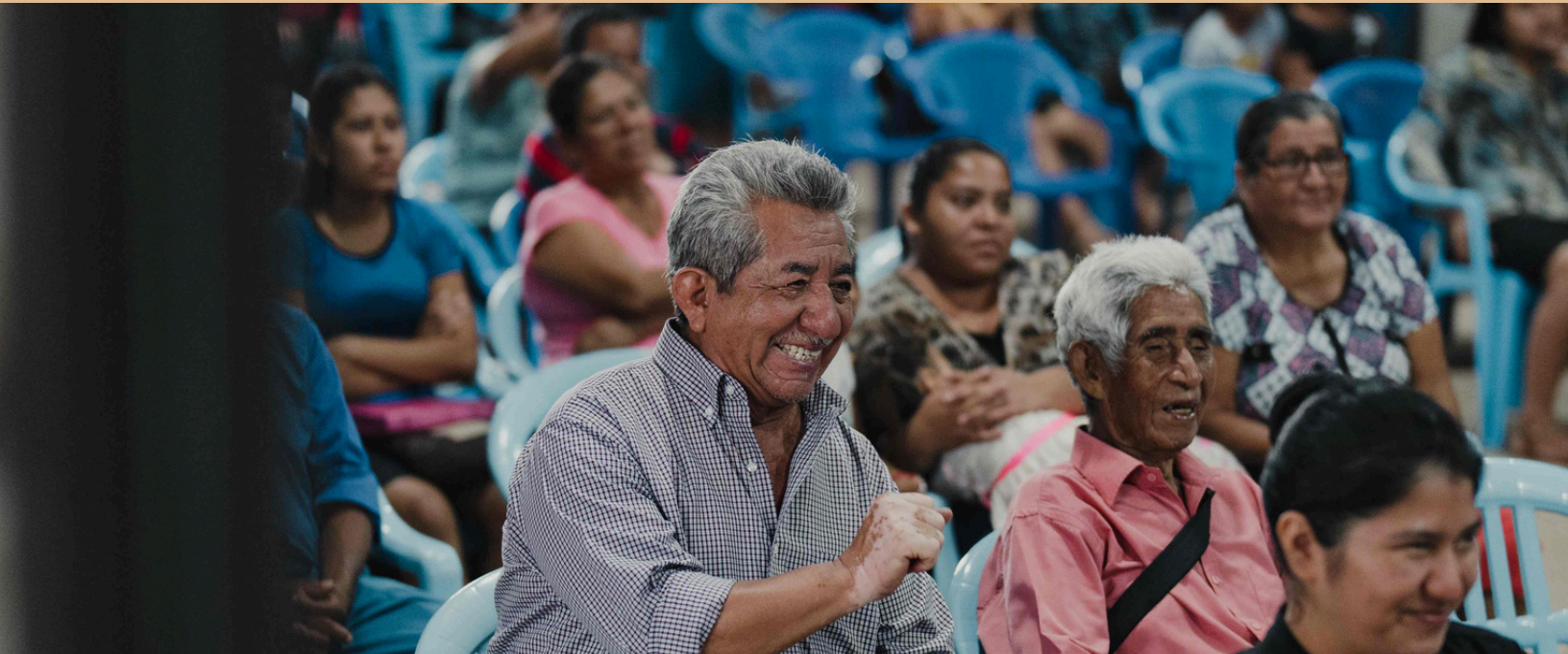

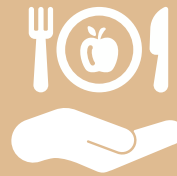

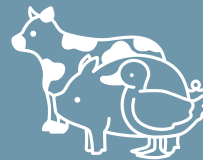

EL SALVADOR

ENLACE El Salvador continues to see measurable impact in alleviating multidimensional poverty in 128 communities. After 30 years of working in El Salvador, ENLACE has seen entire communities emerge from extreme poverty through its health, education, and economic development projects. Last year, local church partners expanded saving groups and grew the number of chicken farm businesses. They also launched a new program that trains families in regenerative agriculture to increase the production of corn, beans, vegetables, fruits, and livestock.

GUATEMALA

ENLACE Guatemala continues to grow steadily and effectively. In 2023, they added five new churches in two new regions of the country and hired and trained two new church coaches. Seven more churches will join in 2024. They continue strengthening local church networks to increase the number of pastors interested in community transformation. They are also focused on increasing the number of partnerships with organizations such as Living Water International, Tearfund, and Habitat for Humanity to increase the number of people served.

NICARAGUA



Despite challenging political conditions, the number of local churches interested in partnering with ENLACE to transform their communities has grown to over 2,500. In 2023, the team worked hard to respond to the growing demand by adding two new regions, hiring three new church coaches, and developing new group training events to add additional churches. The team is also working to develop a new online learning community platform to train a more significant number of church leaders in 2024.



Christian church leaders continued to build effective relationships with Hindu community leaders to serve the most marginalized families. Together they provided livelihood, agricultural, and vocational training to underserved communities. Notably, they established schools for physically challenged and at-risk children, elevating local church partners from exclusion and even persecution into influential roles in their communities.
